







<p>RE.</p> 	<p>In RE we will be focusing on Holi, the popular ancient Hindu festival, also known as the "Festival of Love", the "Festival of Colours" and the "Festival of Spring". The festival celebrates the eternal and divine love of Radha Krishna. Then children will learn about Lent, the 40-day period where people fast. Named after an old English word meaning 'lengthen'. It is a time of reflection and of asking for forgiveness, and when Christians prepare to celebrate Jesus's resurrection at the feast of Easter, which comes at the very end of Lent. Finally, children will learn about Easter, the Christian holiday that celebrates the belief in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.</p>
<p>PSHE</p> 	<p>In Jigsaw our unit is called Healthy Me. Children will learn what they need to keep their body healthy. They will learn what relaxed means and know some things that make them feel relaxed and some that make them feel stressed. They will understand how medicines work in their body and how important it is to use them safely. They will sort foods into the correct food groups and know which foods their body needs every day to keep them healthy.</p>
<p>P.E.</p> 	<p>Children will be learning the game of tennis this half term. Children will be covering an introduction to tennis looking at the court, the basic grip and become familiar with the racket and ball.</p>
<p>Art</p> 	<p>In Art we will be looking at the art element of Line and Pattern with a focus on Printing and Drawing. Children will experiment with a range of drawing techniques. Then they will learn the works of the artist Eileen Agar and write about the feelings they infer from her art. After that, they will explore the techniques used by Eileen Agar, practising in their own way, to create their own piece. Finally, they will use everything they've learnt to produce a final piece which they can critique, appraise and share.</p>

<p>Geography</p> 	<p>This term children will be learn to use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping (Google Earth) to locate countries and describe features studied. They will use aerial images and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic physical features. They will explain symbols on a key and why they are used. They will learn to name and locate the 7 continents, five oceans of the world on a World Map and the earths equator and poles. Finally, they will ask and answer geographical questions such as: What is this place like? What or who will I see in this place? What do people do in this place?</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>Our music focus this half term is called Zoo Time. Children will listen and appraise music, learn and sing songs and play instruments carefully and with respect. They will learn to improvise musically, compose their own pieces and performance what they have learnt.</p>

Additional Information
