We also took part in activities to build our team working and working together.








This week in Base I...





In phonics we follow the RWI Scheme. We have been busy revising and learning our set I, set 2 and have started our set 3 sounds. We have been holding sentences using capital letters and full stops.




In Literacy we have been concentrating on rhyming words and reading and circling the words that rhyme in the story. We have been listening to rhyming songs and we sorted rhyming couplets that match.

In maths we have been concentrating on our number formation to 20 and understanding the concept of subtraction.










This week in Base 2...



We have been reading the book 'Rumble in the Jungle'. In this story there are rhyming words so we have been learning about continuing a rhyming string.

We had lots of fun on the climbing wall that Arthog brought into school. Every single child in Base 2 had a go, no one said they would not try. Some of us even got to the top. We even had the sun out for it!









We are looking after our own butterflies this week! Currently we have 3 butterflies. We gave them orange and sugar water to grow strong before we release them!

In maths we have been learning how to tell the time to the o'clock and half past the hour.

This week in Base 3...

This week pupils have been writing poems on a theme. Pupils have wrote poems about going on to the pirate ship. They have all understood and wrote them brilliantly and I look forward to their chance to shines.

Maths

This week in maths, we have been learning about time. Pupils have learnt o'clock, half past, quarter to, quarter past and reading a clock to 5-minute intervals. Pupils have found this tricky at times but have really tried hard to understand time.

Pupils absolutely loved the Arthog climbing wall—many of the pupils were saying "I'm going to face my fears" and chanting "we can do this". Pupils supported each other and encouraged each other to push past their limits. Every child had a go and the team spirit and resilience of the children was lovely to see. We even had 3 children reach the top!









Literacy

This week in Base 4...

In Literacy this week we have been learning about the Royal Family and King Charles III. We have been looking at non-chronological reports and preparing to write one all about King Charles III. We have also been looking at possessive apostrophes such as the one in the King's crown.








Maths

In maths this week children have been finishing their topic on Statistics. They have learnt how to tally objects, create block graphs and pictograms, including ones where a picture is worth 2,5 or 10 objects. They have been asking questions like who has the most? Who has the least? How many children were there altogether? We made whole class and individual graphs and pictograms.

This week Arthog visited our school and brought a climbing tower taller than a tree. For some of us that looked very tall, but others relished the challenge. We all encouraged each other and got very excited about everyone's success. Base 4 were all brilliant and some even made it right to the very top. Well done everyone!

Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award



Friday Awards

In the news this week

Four children have been found alive after surviving a plane crash and spending forty days alone in Colombia's Amazon jungle. Colombia's president, Gustavo Petro heralded the rescue as a joy for the whole country. The four siblings were the only survivors of the plane that crash landed in the jungle on 1st May. They then became the focus of a massive rescue operation, involving soldiers and local people. Speaking of the incredible feat of survival, Gustavo Petro said, 'They were alone, they themselves achieved an example of total survival which will remain in history'.
