


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


#### Maria and Greyson



In maths we have been exploring ten town to understand, recap and form correctly our numbers I-15 . We have been exploring our number bonds to 10 using Numicon and have explored addition in number sentences.





## This week in Starfish..

In literacy, we have been reading the book 'Billy's bucket'. This is because our summer topic is all about 'Under the Sea'. We read the story and acted it out using role play. We also wrote sentences for different parts of the story.

We have been beginning to use our forest school area as the weather is getting better! This week, we used our natural area to create art. Here are some examples:








In maths, we have been adding numbers together. We have been using the part/whole model to add and subtract numbers. We have been looking at the 'fact families' and particularly using these to find missing numbers.

We have learnt all of our phonics sounds now and are recapping to ensure we are secure with them all. We are making sure we can identify them in words and read them.



#### Literacy

This week in Literacy pupils started their new book. The focus for this genre is the story book 'Meerkat Mail'. Pupils have learnt to use capital letters for days of the week as well as spelling days of the week, in line with what they should be able to do at the end of year I and 2. They have then explored the story by listening to it and retelling the story using a story map.

#### Maths:

In maths, pupils are beginning to understand statistics. This week pupils have made bar charts, tally charts and learnt to understand their meaning as well as creating them. This helps with their lessons in computing, where children are exploring spreadsheets.



#### Music

This week in music, pupils have continued to learn the song 'Your imagination'. This week pupils learnt to play the glockenspiel, learning about the different pitches that the same letter note can make and how the sounds are made. They then used their own song lyrics with

improvisation to adapt the song—which the children thought was really quite funny and tried to make them rhyme!

# This week in Dolphin Class....

We have been learning about significant people in History and how they have effected the world we live in. We have been focussing on Christopher Columbus, Neil Armstrong and Katherine Johnson over the past fortnight and the children have loved learning about the important tasks they completed and how they

changed the landscape for many others who Followed in their paths.



We were also able to learn about a variety of religions and religious festivals in R.E. Learning that even if we do not follow other beliefs, we can still be tolerant and respectful towards others.



In maths we have been learning about multiplication, addition and subtraction and it was lovely to be able to welcome some of the parents into our classroom. The children could show off their skills playing number football and have

promised they will continue to keep practising at home.

We have introduced a new award for Friday's award assembly.


This is in recognition of the fabulous homework most of our children produce. It is also to show the importance of doing homework.




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### Star Player of the week award

Cambridge University has returned four spears to the descendants of an indigenous community in Australia, who crafted them. The four aboriginal spears are all that remain of the forty or so that British explorer, James Cook, and his team took from the Gweagal people more than 250 years ago. On their arrival in Australia in 1770, they became the first known Europeans to reach the country's east coast.
