
his week in Turtles Class.

The children have had a fabulous start adapting to school life. In base I this week our focus text has been "What Makes Me a Me?". We have spoken a lot about ourselves and our families and loved exploring our senses. We walked through a sensory tray and described the textures.



In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds from set I.

In Literacy we have been looking at the story 'What Makes Me a Me'. This taught us that we could achieve anything that we wanted to achieve and also that everyone is different to one another.

In literacy, we have been writing lists and labels. We have used phonics to help us to decode words and our handwriting practise to form letters correctly.

In science, we have been learning about our senses. We went on a senses walk around school and talked about the body parts that help us use our senses.









We also made our own natural frame for our topic 'Marvellous Me'. We talked about how we are all unique. We used natural objects to decorate our frames.

In art we have begun our studies of colour and pattern by continuing our own patterns of a given picture. The children then left their work out to be displayed as they walked round and praised the artwork






This week in Dophins...

Maths


In Maths children have been learning Place Value, they have learnt how a 2-digit number can be parti-






Music






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

Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award


