darker months of the year especially around roads.






This week in Swordfish.....

Computing with Mr Smith

We enjoyed another exciting session with Mr Smith from Amazing ICT. During the workshop, we used robots to help up with our number bonds to IO. We programmed the robots to move forward IO steps on the track, move direction and glow a different colour. Here are a few pictures of our instructions and the robots.







Road Safety

This week we also had a visitor come in to talk to us about road safety. We discussed how we can travel safely in the dark by testing the brightness of different coloured vests. We discovered that yellow was the brightest and would make us easily seen .



Dance

Base 6 took part in a dance session this week where we learnt a street dance routine as well as some break-dancing moves. The children had a fantastic time and were very enthusiastic to showcase their new moves!

Literacy

This week in Literacy we have been looking at character and setting descriptions in narrative writing. Using writing techniques such as similes and personification to up level our expanded noun phrases and paint a picture in the reader's minds. The children then had a 'chance to shine' activity where they were able to write a familiar story that was taking place in a different biome to the one they originally were set in. This gave them a chance to use their science knowledge as well as their setting and character description skills in the most creative ways possible.


Maths:

In Maths we have been learning about multiples and factors. We have been finding prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers as well as multiplying by IOs, IOOs and IOOOs. We have also touched on column multiplication when multiplying by larger numbers. After half term we will be consolidating multiplication then moving on to looking at fractions (equivalent, improper and mixed number.)



Science and Art


In Science we have concluded our unit about life cycles and living things. Having worked extensively looking at living things in different biomes we were able to put all of our knowledge into our own information booklets to show off what we had learned about a variety of different animals and species. We also put our art skills to the test creating wire sculptures of flowers that are found in

The children have been working hard to develop their art skills over the last couple of weeks. We have been focusing on developing our colour work by drawing a range of flowers including lilies and sunflowers. we have learnt in order to develop our skill set and add depth to our routines. In addition to learning new skills and being taught a couple of routines, we also had the opportunity to combine our ideas and create a unique whole class routine.













This week in Sharks...

Over the last two weeks we have been working hard in all our lessons. In maths we have been focusing on learning the complex operation of long division. We have used our multiplication facts learn in number sense to divide 4 digit numbers by 2 digit. In literacy we have been looking at the poem 'The Raven' by Edgar Allen Poe. We have explored the language used in the poem and the story behind the words.


