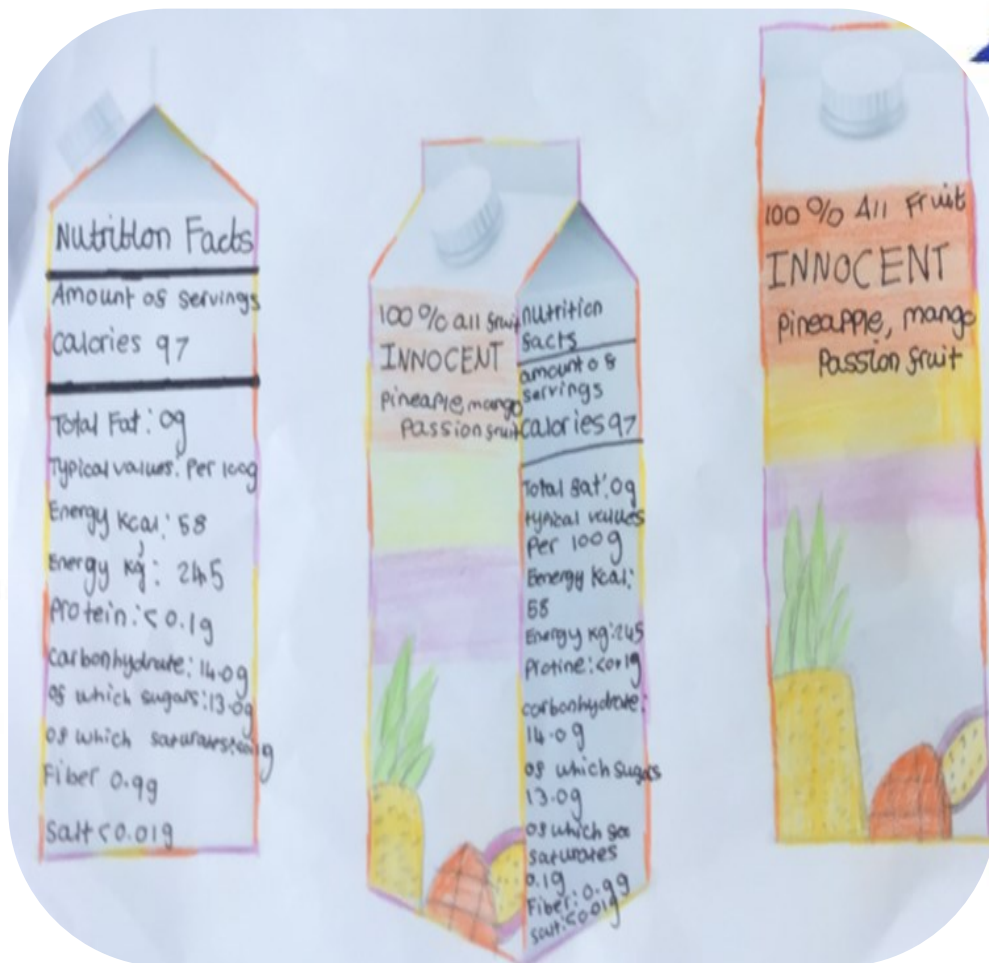

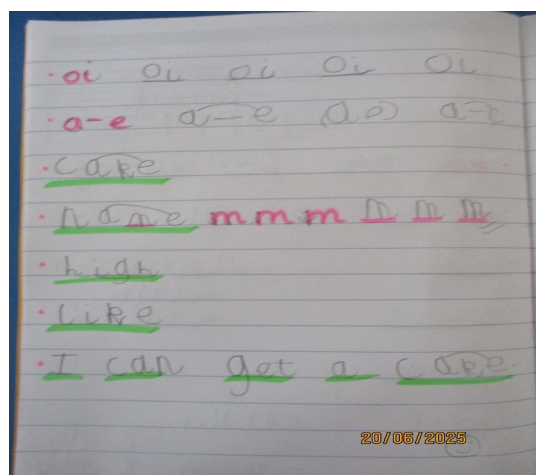

This week in Turtles Class.....

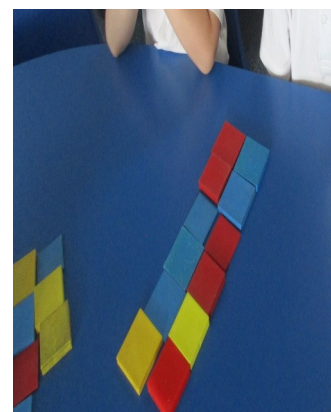


In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds.

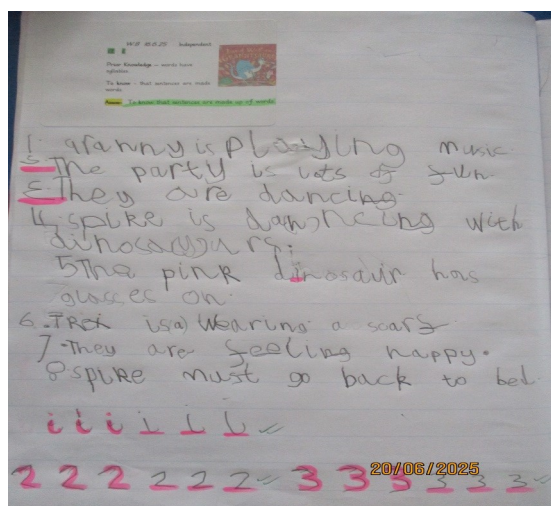


In base 1 we are enjoying our topic called 'All Creatures Great and Small'. We thoroughly enjoyed our sports day!

In maths we have been learning about numbers up to 20 and using tangrams to create different shapes and arrangements.



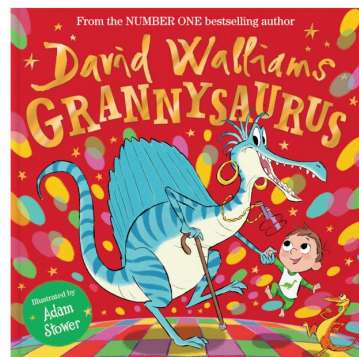

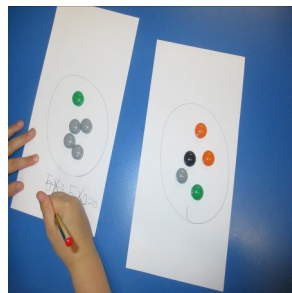
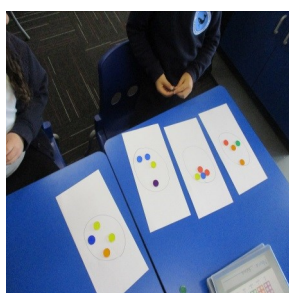
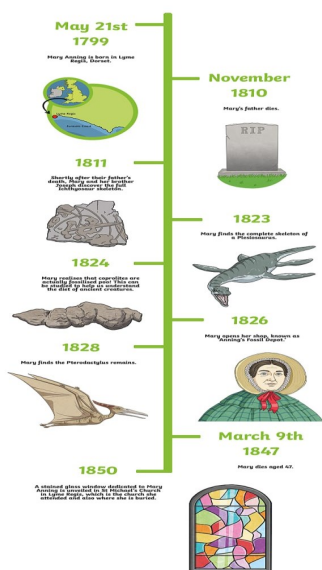


This week in Starfish.

We hope you enjoyed sports day as much as we did. Thank you to all who were able to come and support Key Stage 1. We had a lovely morning.

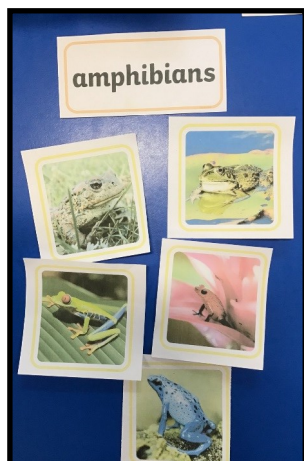
In Maths we have been focusing on equal groups and sharing a number into equal groups. With this, we have been exploring odd and even numbers and how they share or not into groups.

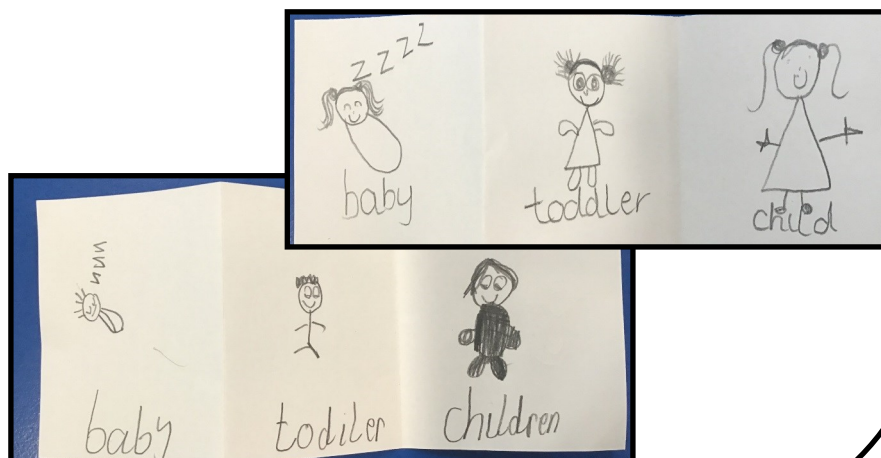
African Drumming with Andy

Last week we had the pleasure of Andy joining us to participate in African Drumming. Andy and the children discussed what they could do with rhythm and how 800 years ago, drums were used to communicate and we then learnt call and respond to play some amazing beats!



PSHE

Design Technology

This week children began a new unit on Structures. To explore structures, children learnt about some famous structures including the tallest buildings in the world and the longest bridges in the world. They were then set the task of constructing a bridge between two chairs, using only paper and tape. We tested their bridges to see how much weight they could hold! Children came up with several different design ideas and worked through challenges to construct their bridges. They joined materials well and understood that their bridge needed to be strong, stiff and reinforced.



RE

This week in RE, we used digital maps to research where the local Mosques are in our area and found that we have quite a few we can visit!

This got us thinking about other special places people of other religions visit and we learnt the names of the 6 main world religions and their places of worship.



PSHE

My Grandpa is AMAZING



In Jigsaw we were discussing the differences between young people and old people. Some children brought in photos of their grandparents and shared special stories about them and discussed how they look different to us and the things they can do that we can't. We read the story My Grandpa is Amazing and found similarities between the grandpa in the story and our own. After that, each child was given a leaf to draw a picture of a special older person in their life. On the back of their leaves, they wrote 2 sentences explaining why they are so special to them. The leaves will eventually go on our Tree of Change display that we are creating during the term.

We have introduced a new award for Friday's award assembly.

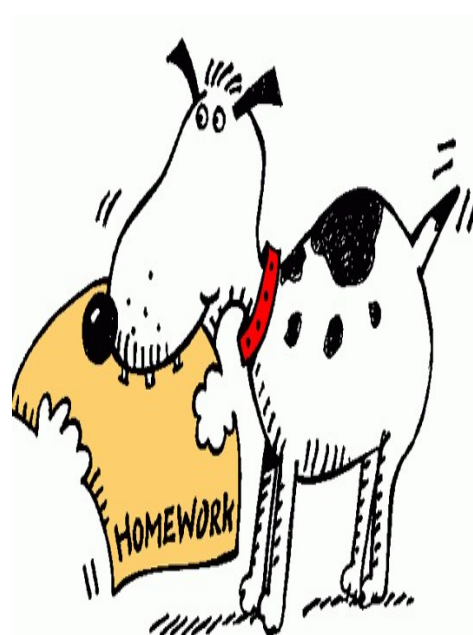
This is in recognition of the fabulous homework most of our children produce. It is also to show the importance of doing homework.

Nearly 140 years after it sank, a team of divers has identified the wreck of a ship, called the SS Nantes, off the coast of Devon, in southwest England. The ship sank in 1888, after crashing into another boat. The shipwreck could finally be named when a diver found a plate with the ship's company logo (or crest) on it.

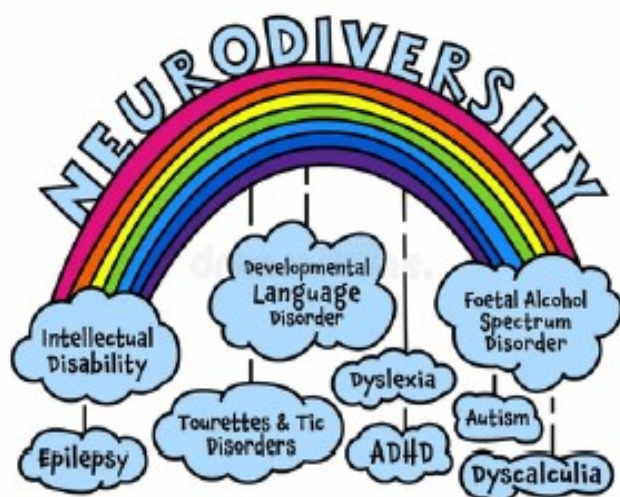
