
This week in Base 1.....


In maths we have been concentrating on our number formation to 20 and understanding the concept of doubling and sharing.







This week in Base 2...



We have been reading the book 'Rumble in the Jungle'. In this story there are rhyming words so we have been learning about continuing a rhyming string.

We were joined by Mr G who showed us how to use apps on the iPads to create pieces of art. We had pictures of our pets and we made speech bubbles to write what they might be saying. We then used an app to make the mouth of our pet move.



We have been learning about animal habitats for our topic. We have been learning about how animals adapt to their habitat. We then went on a bird watch in school to find what birds we have locally. This was just in time for us to learn about birds of prey from our visit from Battlefield Centre. We then made bird feeders to encourage birds to school over summer.



This week in Base 3...

Assessment Week

This week pupils have taken part in assessment week. All pupils have had a spelling, SPaG, arithmetic and two reasoning papers for maths. All pupils have made brilliant progress and have shown real resilience when they have found it difficult. Pupils have actually looked forward to the assessment papers and have used all their taught methods to answer the questions.

Design and Technology

Alongside the assessments this week, pupils have completed their design and technology project. Their project this half term was to use wheels and axels. Pupils first looked at cars and how they worked and how wheels, axels and axel holders work together to move a car. They then designed their cars (bumper car style) before creating their car using wheels, toilet rolls and cocktail sticks.

Next the pupils will paint the cars in a design of their choosing before racing their cars to see which style worked best.

Maths


In Maths we have been looking at position and direction. This is everything from right and left, clockwise and anti-clockwise including whole turns, half turns and quarter turns and in front of, behind, next to. We have been pretending to be robots and given each other directions.




DT

We have introduced a new award for Friday's award assembly.


This is in recognition of the fabulous homework most of our children produce. It is also to show the importance of doing homework.


