Pick up from school will be arranged when children finish school and collection times can be either be 4.30pm or 5.30pm depending on your needs.


Spaces are limited so we do require you to collect a booking form from the pre-school and return as soon as possible.


A big thank you to Cody and Kevins for all their hard work cleaning and tidying up the role and play area. They did a great job!

Art

This week in Art we have finally finished our mosaics! It has been a lengthy process to create our tiles, decorate and decide the arrangements to piece them together.

This week the children took part in the annual Sports Day event, where they got to compete with their peers across a range of events. It was a fantastic morning with all children thoroughly enjoying the events and seeing the parents and teachers compete in the sprint race - Miss Goring is the 2024 champion! The children participated brilliantly throughout the morning and their behaviour was excellent. Ask your child which event was

their favourite and what skills were needed to succeed on each one. A huge thank to all those that attended - we hope you enjoyed it just as much as we did.















The children have been learning all about the different types of angles this week. We have come across lots of new vocabulary including: obtuse, acute, right angle and parallel lines. Ask your child what the difference is between the different angles and which shapes have parallel lines in them. Along with angles, we have also looked at regular and irregular polygons. We learned that a polygon must be a closed, 2D shape, have straight sides that are equal, and have equal angles. Ask your child to draw some regular and irregular polygons.



The children have been learning all about 'Light and Dark' as part of our new science topic. We have learnt about different light sources and how some materials reflect light, whereas others absorb light. See if your child can give you any examples from what we have discovered this week. As part of this week's homework, get your child to experiment with making shadows. Get them to think about the different light sources they could use for this (sun, lamp, torch...).



The children worked in small teams to carry out a 'sorting' activity.

We discussed various light sources that we might find around the household.



This week in Belugas....

To celebrate world oceans day, the Belugas enjoyed creating a piece of artwork with their parents for the open afternoon. Together, the children and their families created a landscape picture including a beluga whale and used chalk pastels to create a sunset. All of the children thoroughly enjoyed having their families in the classroom to share their learning with them. Thank you to everyone who attended!

















Finally, the children enjoyed sports day this week. All of the children worked really hard and showed their amazing team work by cheering each other on and celebrating each others accomplishments. Another fantastic couple of weeks here in Octopus Class...
















Within our French lessons we have continued to develop our skills and broaden our vocabulary. Over the past two weeks we have learnt the days of the week, along with a range of classroom commands. We played the French version of 'Simon Says' which is called Jacques a dit. We used the games to practise a range of instructions such as asseyez vou, levez vou, montre moi, ecoute, repetez, regardez, arret and silence. It has been fantastic to see how enthusiastic the children have been about their French lessons and it is amazing how much they can remember between lessons too! Some children have even been playing Jacques a dit at home with their families, showcasing the skills that they have learnt and using this knowledge to teach them the new game.

This week in Sharks





Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award


