


This week in Swordfish.....

Another action packed and fun filled couple of weeks in Swordfish.....


We enjoyed an exciting session with Mr Smith from Amazing ICT. During the workshop, we were introduced to Scratch using an Ancient Greek template. We learnt how to alter the direction and variables of sprites, add other Greek characters such as Zeus and Griffins as well as edit the background. Here are some images of the work we created during the workshop......





We have enjoyed learning about our new genre in English: Greek myths! Throughout our lessons, we have delved into several stories including *The Wrekin Giant* and *Jason and the Golden Fleece*. This week the children have been working hard on their character descriptions of a mythical dragon and brave hero, using similes and metaphors to bring their writing to life. There have been some very impressive descriptions that have created a fantastic image in the reader's mind.

In maths, we completed a problem-solving lesson focused on finding all possibilities. In groups, the children worked systematically exploring every possible answers to and recording their results. The children were enthusiastic as they eagerly discovered each solution and explained their methods of working them out. Here are some examples of their many answers and workings out.





In science, we have continued exploring electricity by building our own circuits. Last week, we predicted whether certain circuits would work or not and then tested them out. Then, this week we conducted an experiment to see whether certain materials are electrical conductors or electrical insulators.

Literacy

This week in Literacy we have looked at deforestation, for what purposes trees are being chopped down and the impact it is having on biodiversity. The children have been considering both sides of the arguments and will be presenting their ideas as part of a class debate using persuasive language to change others views.

Maths:


In Maths we have been using rounding to consolidate our place value knowledge as well as comparing, and ordering numbers up to I million. We will be moving on to Addition and Subtraction over the next 2 weeks so any practise at home will be extremely beneficial.

Science

This week in Science we have been looking at life cycles of plants, animal and humans. We have learnt about mammals and the way different animals look after their young. We have also learned about flower pollination and practised sketching flowers in our sketch books.







This week in Sharks





Book publishing company, Penguin Random House UK, has revealed a new book vending machine at Linlithgow Academy, near Edinburgh, Scotland. The machine gives the pupils access to more than seventy different books from Penguin's 'Lit in Colour' reading lists. The reading lists, set up around four years ago, are updated each year and aim to make works by writers of colour more visible and accessible in schools.
