This week in Turtles Class....




In base I this week our focus has been looking at Remembrance and the story of the Gingerbread Man. We painted our own poppies and thought about the colours we needed to use.



In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds from set 1.




In Literacy we have been writing some words using the sounds we have been learning in our phonics. We have been discussing the main character in the story and what their feelings and motives were.





In maths we have been making repeated patterns using lots of different ways. Our ten town number of the week is 4.










This week in Starfish...

In Science we have been learning about materials. We found different objects in our class room and discussed what they are made from. We focused on glass, wood, metal and plastic. We talked about these materials properties.







Maths


This week in maths, we have been securing our understanding of fact families and how addition and subtraction are related. This children found it tricky to understand that the

whole number and = might be at the start of the number sentence, so we used moveable calculations to see what changes & what stays the same.

This months musician is Bjork and the children have loved dancing to her song 'Earth Intruders' and seeing the visual arts in the music videos she has created.








Interfaith week

The children looked deeper into festivals across religions and then created their own divas.




This week in Dophins...

In Literacy children have been learning how to write a Recount. This week children learnt the features of a recount. Children reviewed 1st Person pronouns, exclamation sentences and past tense verbs from previous grammar lessons and learnt the meaning of "chronological order". Children were then given an example of a recount with a checklist of the features, they used crayons to colour the features in the text as they found them.










Design Technology



Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award


