#### Dear Parents and Carers,

#### CHRISTMAS PERFORMANCE:

#### CHRISTMAS JUMPER DAY:

# This week in Turtles Class.....












In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds from set I.

In Literacy we have been using a range of vocabulary making sure we articulate our sentences correctly through drawing the postman's journey on large pieces of paper and talking about it.





In maths we have been focusing on 2D shapes and using these shapes to make pictures. Our ten town number of the week is 6.





# his week in Starfish


In literacy, we have been reading the story of the 'Little White Owl'. We drew how the owl would be feeling at different parts of the story and also designed our own magical owl. We then wrote sentences to describe how the owl might be feeling, ensuring we use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In maths, we have been learning about shapes, both 2d and 3d shapes. We have been looking at the properties and these shapes and where we might find them around our classroom, for example, our bottles are mostly cylinders.

As well as all of this, we have also been practising our production ready to perform to you all, we are very excited!













In Science we have been learning about materials. We found different objects in our class room and discussed what they are made from. We focused on glass, wood, metal and plastic. We talked about these materials properties.

# This week in Seahorses

#### Design & Technology

n D&T this term, we are learning how to sew. First, the children evaluated different types of products to understand their purposes, material and how they were made. They then made a design of their own with the criteria of keeping Jigsaw Jo's hands warm. They then practiced different sewing techniques; an overstitch and a running stitch; created templates and cut our their felt mittens ready for sewing for Jo!

#### Literacy

In literacy, we are back to writing a story, this time in first person! The children have worked very hard on understanding first person is all about me, myself and I, and they have also begun to understand how to use commas. Their favourite lesson so far in literacy however, has been re-enacting their version of our text, taking on the role of Henry the hedgehog and his abrupt awakening from hibernation!







Music

In music we have practiced finding the pulse, singing along and rapping a verse (this was their favourite part) and finally using the notes B, A and G on the glockenspiels!











# This week in Dophins...

This half term, Base 4 have continued their new music theme called 'Ho Ho Ho'. Children recapped previous learning of puse, and worked on staying in time to the pulse and discussed the structure of our class song. Children were then reintroduced to the musical instrument the glockenspiel. Children learnt where the notes A, B and G were, which were the notes needed to accompany their class song. Children took it in turns to play along to the song whilst their classmates sang.



#### Design Technology

In DT children learnt that a pattern is a 2D template that are traced onto woven or knitted fabrics before being cut out and assembled. They each cut out a paper pattern/template in the shape of a pair of mittens. We know the pattern/ template must be bigger because the material needs to be bigger, as the outside of the material will be used for sewing. We must ensure the mittens fit on Jigsaw Jo to keep her hands warm over winter. After that, they placed the pattern/ template on top of the felt they had chosen for their mittens. They each cut out 4 parts and learnt that they would need two pieces for each mitten



#### Computing

This half term in computing, the children in Dolphins have been learning how to use different tools on a computer for a purpose, such as to fill and undo. We then improved our ability of using shapes and line. Here we recreated the work of the artist Piet Mondrian.







## Homework of the week award

We need to ensure that children are equipped to be able to complete homework, as a school we are looking at our homework offer and adapting it to meet the needs of the children.




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### Star Player of the week award


