Please can I ask you to remind the children about not wearing the following jewellery:


- No hooped earrings, children should be wearing studs, hoops can get caught in clothing and tear their earlobes.

Safer Internet Day

11th February 2025

Safer Internet Day 2025 will take place on the IIth of February 2025, with celebrations and learning based around the theme 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'

Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year we cover an online issue or theme that speaks about the things young people are seeing and experiencing online. Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others, as well as what support is available to them.

About the theme

This Safer Internet Day we will assess the real scale of scams online and allow young people to share their experiences and ideas on how to tackle the problem. We'll build on the important work being done to raise awareness of issues such as online financial sextortion and we'll also consider the future of scams, answering questions such as:


- · How is changing technology like generative Al going to impact the approach of scammers?



This week in Turtles Class....




In base I we have been enjoying learning about Chinese New Year painting chines symbols and different materials including soft, hard and stretchy.



In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds from set 1.


In maths we have been focusing on measuring items finding out what is heavier than, lighter than, bigger and smaller. Our ten town number of the week is 9.

Computing

This term in computing, we have been learning how to command a robot. We have learnt the buttons, turns and language needed to command the robot, and this week we learnt how to input, clear, and alter a sequence for it to follow. We then applied our learning to Mr Smith's robot, the Cubetto!






Literacy










Art:

In art, we have been researching Rodrigo Franzao and his work of lines and texture. We have been interpreting his abstract forms and practicing these techniques to build up our art skills.











This week in Dophins...

Jigsaw

In PSHE children have set themselves goals they would like to achieve. This week they explored how working as a team can help them to achieve their goal. They spent time working in groups supporting each other to achieve their goals. At the end of the lesson they showed the progress they had made and discussed what worked well and problems that occurred whilst working together.









Computing

This week in Dolphins we discussed what we already knew about sequencing and how we sequence in maths. Mr Smith visited us to teach us how to program a robot through sequencing. The robot was called Cubutto. We each took it in turns to add tiles to the control board and observed how the robot moved. We quickly learnt that the green tiles made the robot move forwards, the yellow turned left, and the red turned right. We learnt that we could make the robot do a sequence of 4 moves in one go by using the function tool, this worked as a shortcut to make the robot do a full turn, for example:

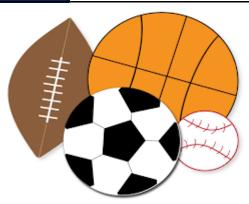



In the news this week

The Nepalese government has announced that, from September, climbers aiming for the world's highest mountain will have to pay just over £12,000 (\$15,000) during the main climbing season. This is over \$4,000 more than the previous permit fee for climbing Mount Everest. There have been concerns that there are too many people climbing the mountain, leaving rubbish and not respecting nature. It is hoped the extra money will go towards protecting the area from tourists.
