

#### EAT WELL PROJECT

We as a school have been selected to take part in the Telford and Wrekin Council Eatwell Project, part of the Health and Wellbeing Programme.

Part of the school's curriculum is to teach children about healthy eating, and we have an exciting opportunity where your child will take part in the Eatwell sessions.

The 5 A Day Session for Reception and Key Stage I will focus on the 5 a day key message and importance of eating fruit and vegetables along with food sampling.

The Eatwell Guide Session for Key Stage 2 will focus on children understanding the different food groups, why each one is important and the effects on their health.

The Sugar Awareness Session for Key Stage 2 will introduce children to the different types of sugar and how much sugar it is recommended they eat a day. The children will have the opportunity to use the NHS food scanner app to see how much sugar is in different foods.

All sessions will be run by the Eatwell project and are aimed at being informative, interactive and fun! The Eatwell Team look forward to welcoming the children to the sessions!








# la Bolse 5

Learning to control the ball and swing the club correctly.



# This week in Swordfish.....

#### Literacy




#### History

In History, we are going to be learning about the Mayans. This week, we activated our prior knowledge on continents and climate which will help us in our future lessons. We will be exploring who the Maya were, where they lived, how they lived and what they believed in.



#### Science



This term, we are focusing on animal classification. We have started to look at how animals are grouped and their characteristics We discussed why classification is important and who created it (Carl Linnaeus). In a few weeks time, we will have a visit from an Animal Man who will bring a variety of animals in for the children to see as well as talking about their habitat and classification.

#### Literacy

#### Swimming








## This week in Octopi ....

In our first lesson, we had a discussion about the book's cover and made predictions about what might happen in the story. During our conversation, we explored various themes that could arise in the book. In our English lessons, we've been using the story to enhance our linguistic skills, focusing on techniques such as parenthesis and the use of past and present tenses. These tools will help us improve cohesion in our writing. We're all excited to read the next few chapters of the book and see if our predictions are accurate.

Throughout the day, we explored the history of VE Day, discovering how it has been commemorated over the years and why it holds such significance. 


# This week in Sharks...



As you know our school is taking part in a road safety and active travel project, called A New School Journey. As part of this project, our school has been chosen to take part in 'Re-wheeled', a bicycle donation, refurbishment and recycling project. The scheme is run by Telford & Wrekin's Active Travel and Road Safety Team and asks that parents/carers or anyone connected with the school donate any unused bicycles or scooters to school on a specific date (tbc). These will be collected, assessed, repaired where possible, serviced and returned to the school for anyone who doesn't have access to a bike offering a sustainable provision of cycles for your school and pupils.

You will not receive the bikes you have donated back but they will be used in school for cycling activities or gifted to pupils without access to a bike or scooter.

Please note: Ebikes, tandems or tricycles cannot be accepted but any standard 2-wheel bicycles and scooters can be donated.
