

This week in Turtles Class.....







In base I we are enjoying our topic called 'All Creatures Great and Small'. We enjoyed our open afternoon with our parents and we created some of our own pigs. We absolutely loved our balance bike days learning how to use the balance bikes and how to stay safe.

In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds.


In maths we have been learning about repeating patterns and numbers beyond IO, matching numeral to quantity using numicon.







In Literacy we have been finishing off our learning abut the story 'The Three Little Pigs.' We have been writing sentences using substitution grids and we have created our own talk plan story maps.







This week in Starfish

We have been reading the Three Little Pigs. We have been using our writing skills to retell and rewrite the story. We are focusing on the correct punctuation; capital letter, full stops, finger spaces, and using conjunctions to make our sentences more interesting.

In Science, we have been learning about different groups of animals and the names of these groups of animals. We have learnt about reptiles, fish, mammals, amphibians and birds. We have explored what makes the animals fit into these groups.

In computing with Mr Smith, we were exploring how to use technology for research. We can use an iPad as a microscope to explore smaller creatures. Mr Smith used the green screen to put us with creatures.





In Maths we have been learning how to add two numbers together. We have been working with larger numbers and exploring the fastest way to add numbers. We have been adding the tens and ones separately to find the total.



This week in Seahorses.


Maths:



VE Day








ICT with Mr Smith

Music

This week in Music, children recapped previous learning of pulse, and worked on staying in time to the pulse. Children were then introduced to the musical instrument the glockenspiel. Children first learnt where the notes G and E were and learnt a simple accompaniment to the song. After that, children learnt a harder tune consisting of, B, G, A and E, which they thoroughly enjoyed the challenge of. They found it helpful to sing along the notes as they played to remind them of the sequence of the notes. Children took it in turns to play along to the song whilst their classmates sang the notes.









Science

As part of our science lesson children went outside onto the play-ground and ran a lap of the top and bottom playgrounds. Children were observing the effects that exercise has on their bodies. They noticed that their heartbeat became faster, their breathing became faster and their skin wetter (perspiration) after exercising. Everyone had a good drink of water after and understood the important of staying hydrated. Children understood that it is important to exercise regularly to help our muscles and bones grow healthily.



Maths

Children explored odd and even numbers. They learnt that all multiples of 2 are even and end in the digits 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8. Children were able to use concrete resources to see how

even numbers have an equal number of twos, but odds always have an extra one.

We need to ensure that children are equipped to be able to complete homework, as a school we are looking at our homework offer and adapting it to meet the needs of the children.



In the news this week

A vehicle once used by Pope Francis to wave and greet people—called a popemobile—is being turned into a mobile health clinic for children in Gaza. Pope Francis, who recently passed away, was the head of the Catholic Church and often spoke about helping others. One of his final wishes was to help children affected by the conflict in Gaza. The vehicle will be refitted with medical equipment, as found in ambulances, so it can be used to aid children in areas where hospitals may be hard to reach. The project aims to deliver essential medical care to those who need it.
