

Governor's Page




Hello!


Ultimately, staff governors help the governing body stay connected to the school community. Their presence ensures that policies are not made in a vacuum and that decisions reflect the reality of school life.






Sensory Workshop for Parents & Carers








In Seals...

Science

We have finished our unit on Magnets and Forces we have learned about Friction, Gravity and Magnetism. We have tested how strong different magnets are, tested how different surfaces effect friction and experimented with Newton meters with objects in the classroom.

We now understand that we all follow written rules so everything is fair and everyone can stay safe. We did a canvas based on our page in the book We Are All Born Free by Amnesty International.

Maths

In Maths, we have been exploring multiplication. We have practiced multiplying numbers by 10 and 100. We have also started learning the written method for multiplication!

Jigsaw

In Jigsaw this week, we explored what an emergency is and discussed a range of situations where calling 999 would be necessary. The children thought carefully about which emergency service—police, fire, or ambulance—would be most appropriate in each scenario. We also learned how to make a 999 call, including the important information to give the operator to ensure help arrives quickly.



Konflux Theatre

This week, we had an exciting workshop with Konflux Theatre, where we explored British Values through a range of interactive games and drama activities. The children learned about key values such as democracy, respect, and individual liberty. For example, we demonstrated democracy by voting for which game to play, and took part in activities that encouraged us to show respect and work together, celebrating our differences.



Can you tell someone at home what the British Values are?






This week in Octopi...

This week in Maths we have been learning to multiply fractions by integers in order to solve problems such as 'find $\frac{2}{3}$ of 24'. We have also been preparing for our Maths tests.

In Literacy, we are preparing to write our narrative for this term which is writing our own version of chapter 3 of the text 'Journey to Jo'burg' by Beverley Naidoo. We will be putting our own personal spin on the story, and flexing our creative writing muscles by describing delicious oranges.



In Geography, we have been investigating Fairtrade and discovering how the organisation supports farmers and producers around the world. We have looked at how they ensure fair wages, safe working conditions and sustainable practices in the coffee and banana industries.

Finally in D&T, we are planning to cook a plantain stew. We have looked at all the different ingredients, such as kidney beans, onions and carrots, and evaluated why they are healthy for us. We are also going to look at how to cook safely and cleanly.






This week in Sharks


