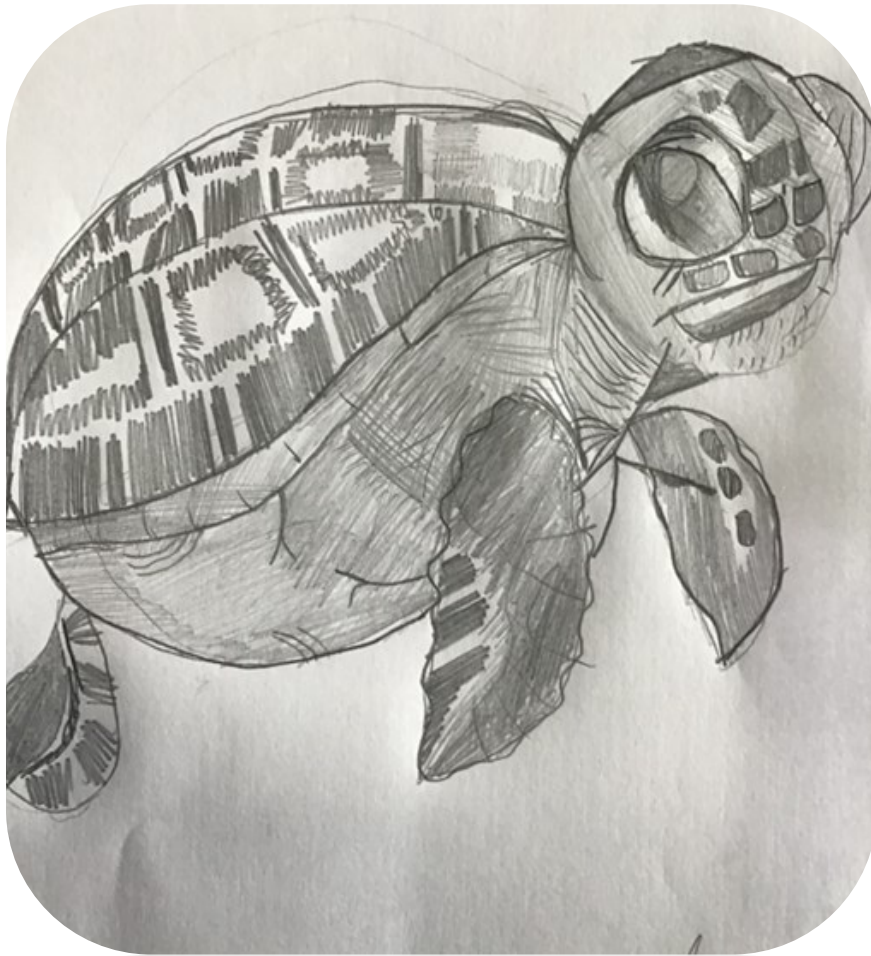

Register by 4pm on 26th June (12th June for pupils requiring SEND arrangements)

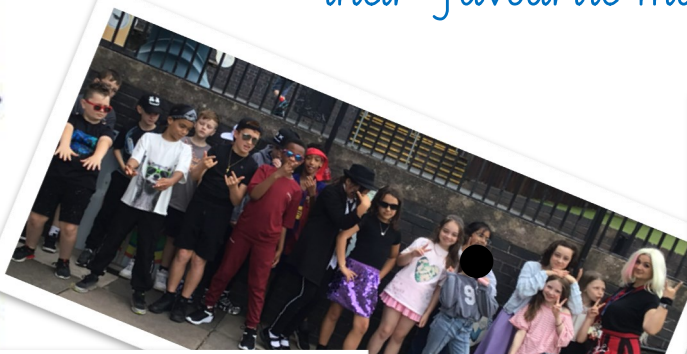

This week in Turtles...

Another great couple of weeks here in Turtle's class.

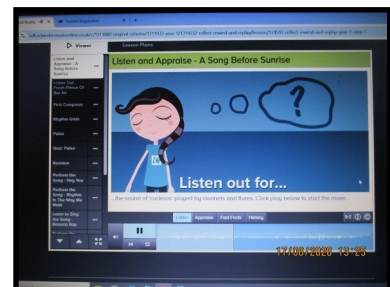
We have enjoyed exploring our literacy text 'The Fish Who Could Wish' by John Bush. Throughout the last couple of weeks we have spent time exploring the text, focusing on securing a good understanding of the chronology of the text to enable the children to accurately recall the narrative using roleplay. Following on from this, the children wrote sentences about the beginning, middle and end of the narrative, completed a talk plan and explored the wishes the fish made through a piece of descriptive writing.



In maths, the children have been exploring sharing equally. We have explored sharing between groups of 2, 3 and 4 and discussed and identified how we share differently between these amounts whilst maintaining an equal amount. We have also explored what happens when we have a remainder, especially when looking at sharing equally between larger groups.



In music this week, we have been exploring 'A Song Before Sunrise' composed by Fredrick Delius. The children explored the orchestral piece, discovering the instruments contained within the composition, whilst also learning about the history of the piece and how to find the pulse.





This week in Starfish.

The story we have been reading in literacy is 'The fish who could wish'. We have used adjectives in sentences to describe the fish. We have also been expanding our sentences using the conjunction 'and'.

We had a great time at sports morning. We hope you enjoyed it to!



In Maths, we have been learning about money and the value of coins. We have been adding money together to find the total and talking about what we can buy with an amount of money.



In D+T, we have designed our own bridge. We looked at famous bridges and their engineer that has designed them. We then designed our own bridge.

Science

In Science we learnt about how to protect ourselves whilst in the sun. We learnt the importance of wearing a sun hat, sun cream and to wear sunglasses with UV protection. We then completed a little experiment to see whether we should wear light or dark coloured clothes in the sun by melting ice on different coloured card. The ice cube on the black card melted fastest, showing that darker colours absorb the sun rays, whereas the white was the last,



Geography

The children have put their geographer skills to the test, using an atlas to find Brazil and name its surrounding countries, then researching the capital, landmarks and climate!

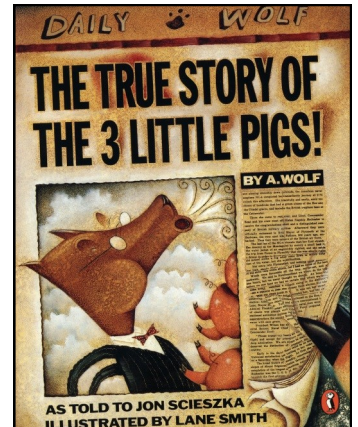




This week in Dolphins..

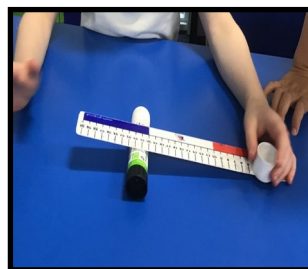
Literacy

In Literacy this week we have started looking at newspaper reports. Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award

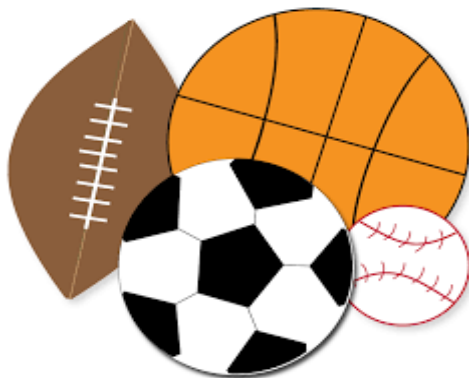
