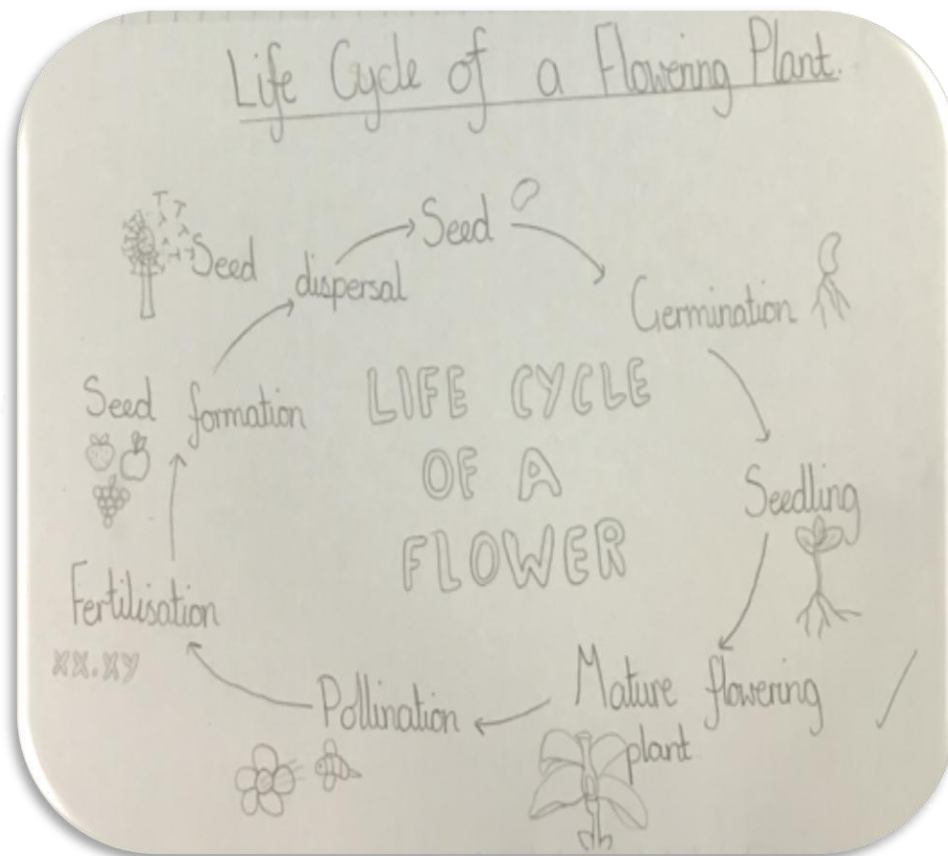

PARENTS

The Information You Need!

NUT ALLERGY:

24.9 ~ School Parliament canvassing begins

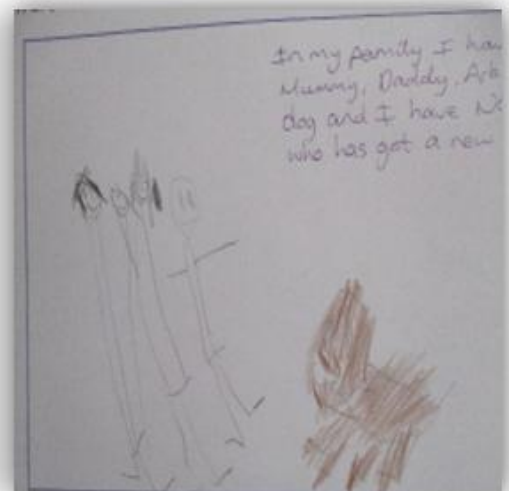

This week in Turtles...

This week in Turtles we have been working hard to settle into the new school routine and understanding and following the class rules. We have done really well settling in and have really impressed our teachers!



This week in maths we have been working hard to recognise number 1 and we used our cutting skills to match the correct numicon pieces together.

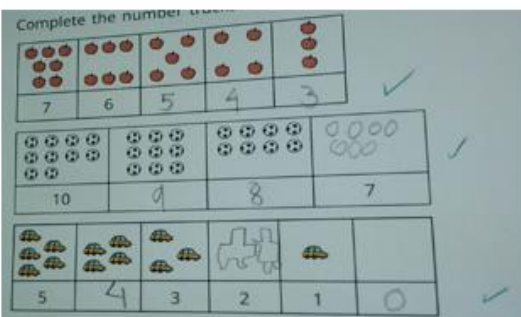


This week we have painted our own self-portraits and drew our families. We thought about the colours we needed to use and used colours for a purpose. We discussed who is in our family and who lives in our house.

This week in Starfish...



In literacy this week, we have been reading the story Tidy by Emily Gravett. We have been ordering images from the story to orally retell the story. We have then been using our phonics knowledge to help us to spell key words from the story.



In maths, we have been learning our numbers up to 10. We have been looking at one more and one less than a given number. We have also been learning to subitise up to 10.

In geography, we have been learning about our local area. We have learnt that Telford is in England, which is part of the UK. We have been learning about some of the local features by using Google maps such as the local pools and what they would look like on a map.

In science, we have been learning about materials. We learnt why objects are made from certain materials and about some of their properties. We learnt some key words such as transparent and flexible to describe the properties of these materials.



This week in Seahorses...

This week in ICT, we have learnt the importance of sequencing our commands. We asked what is the same and what is different and then used 4 of the same commands in a different order in multiple algorithms. We learnt that if they are not ordered accurately, the robots will end up in a different place!



This week in maths, we have been learning new facts with place value. The children can separate tens and ones and recognise their value within a number and have now begun exploring partitioning 2-digit numbers in different ways, recognising there is more than one way to separate a number.

This week in science, we have been recapping our knowledge about living things. We were able to group animals based on their characteristics into their animal groups and remembered a bird has feathers, an amphibian can live on land or in water, a reptile is dry, has scales and lays eggs, and that a mammal has live young. We then learnt about which are alive, have once been alive or have never been alive by discussing the living processes and meeting MRS GREN!

Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award

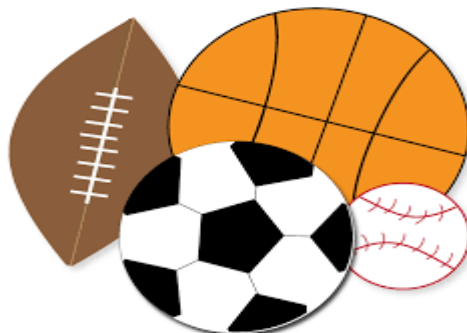
